# Connecticut From 10,000 Feet

- Connecticut is one of the wealthiest states in the country
- AECF consistently ranks CT among the best states for child well-being and family economic security outcomes

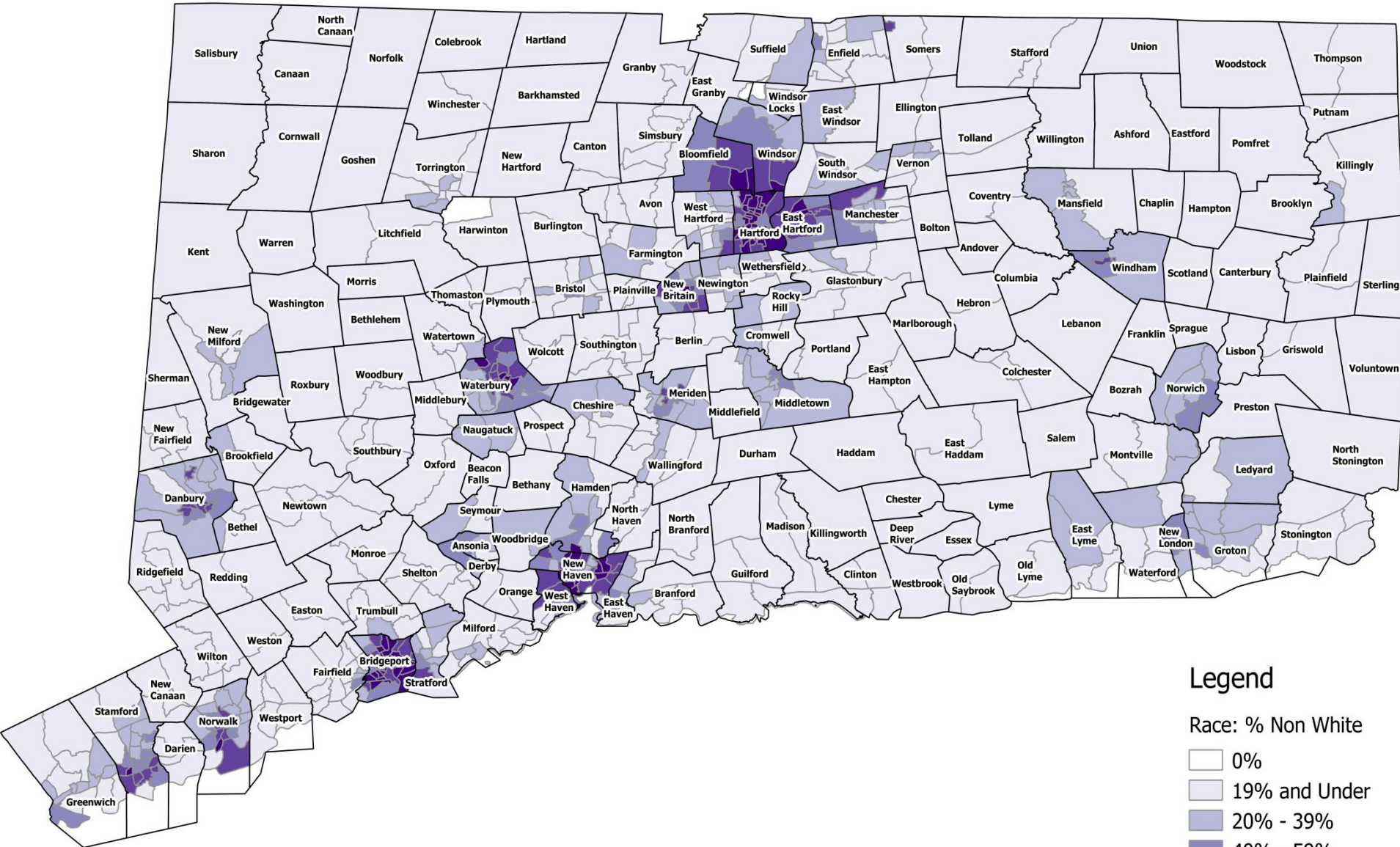
# Need For More Detail

- Comparisons between Connecticut and the rest of the country are based on statewide averages
- On average, CT is
  - Almost 70% non-Hispanic White
  - Median income of ~\$69K
- Not what most of your cities look like

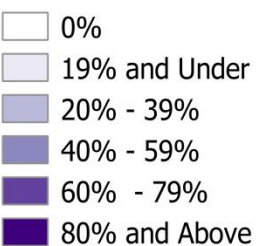

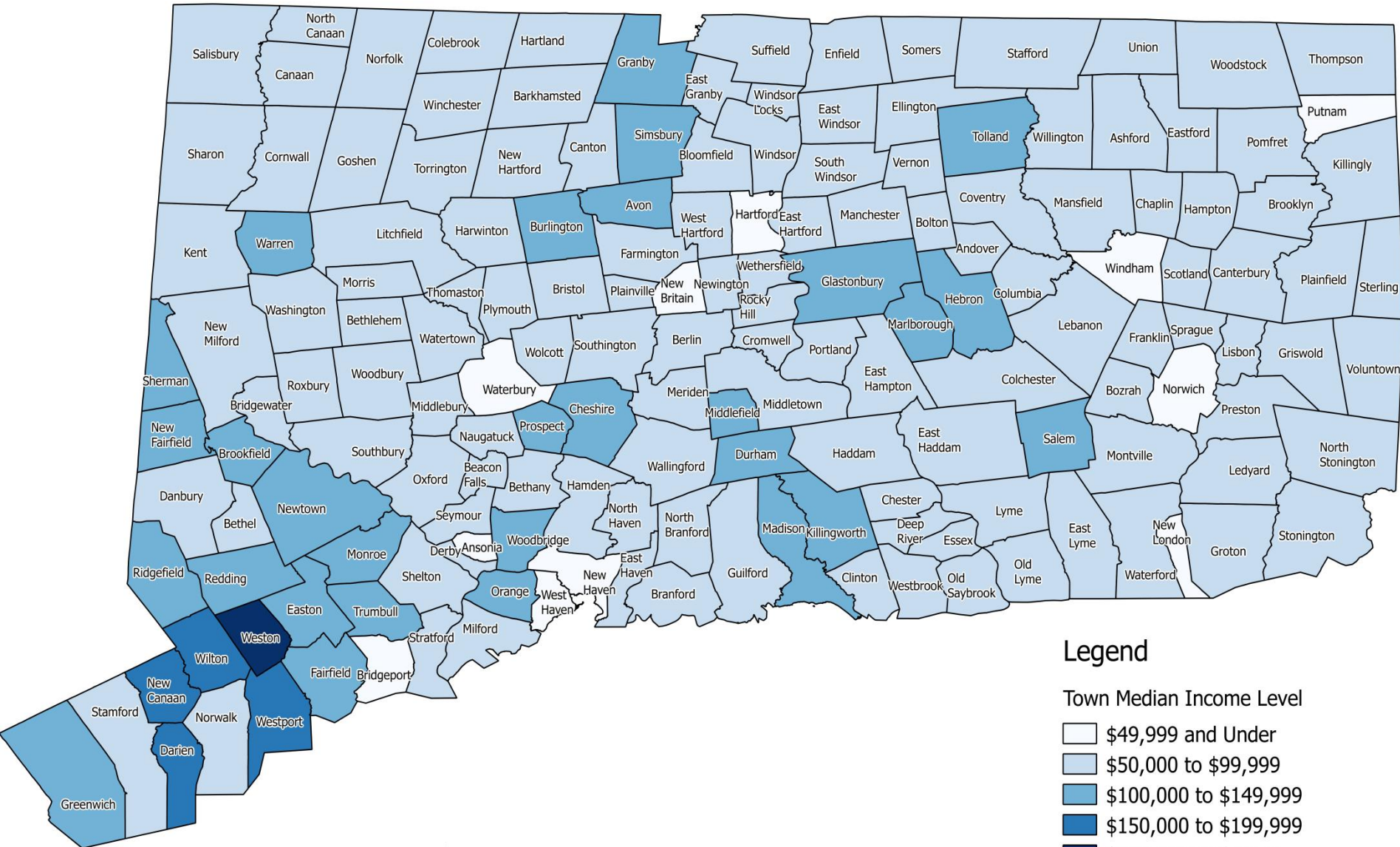


# Disaggregation

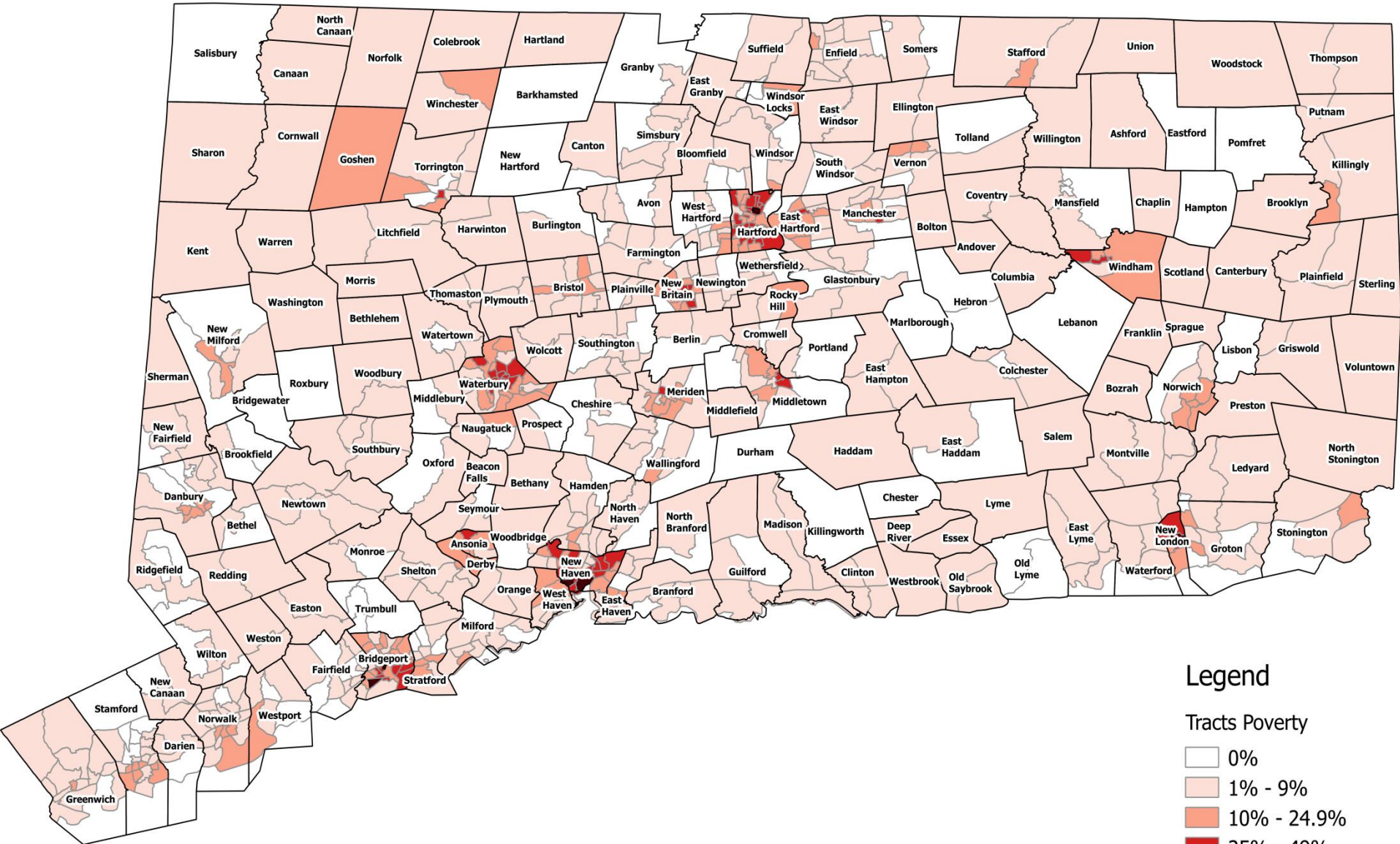


# Connecticut Median Household Income



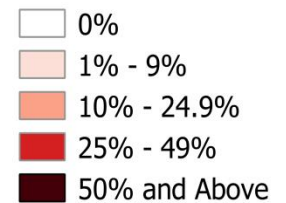

Tracts Poverty



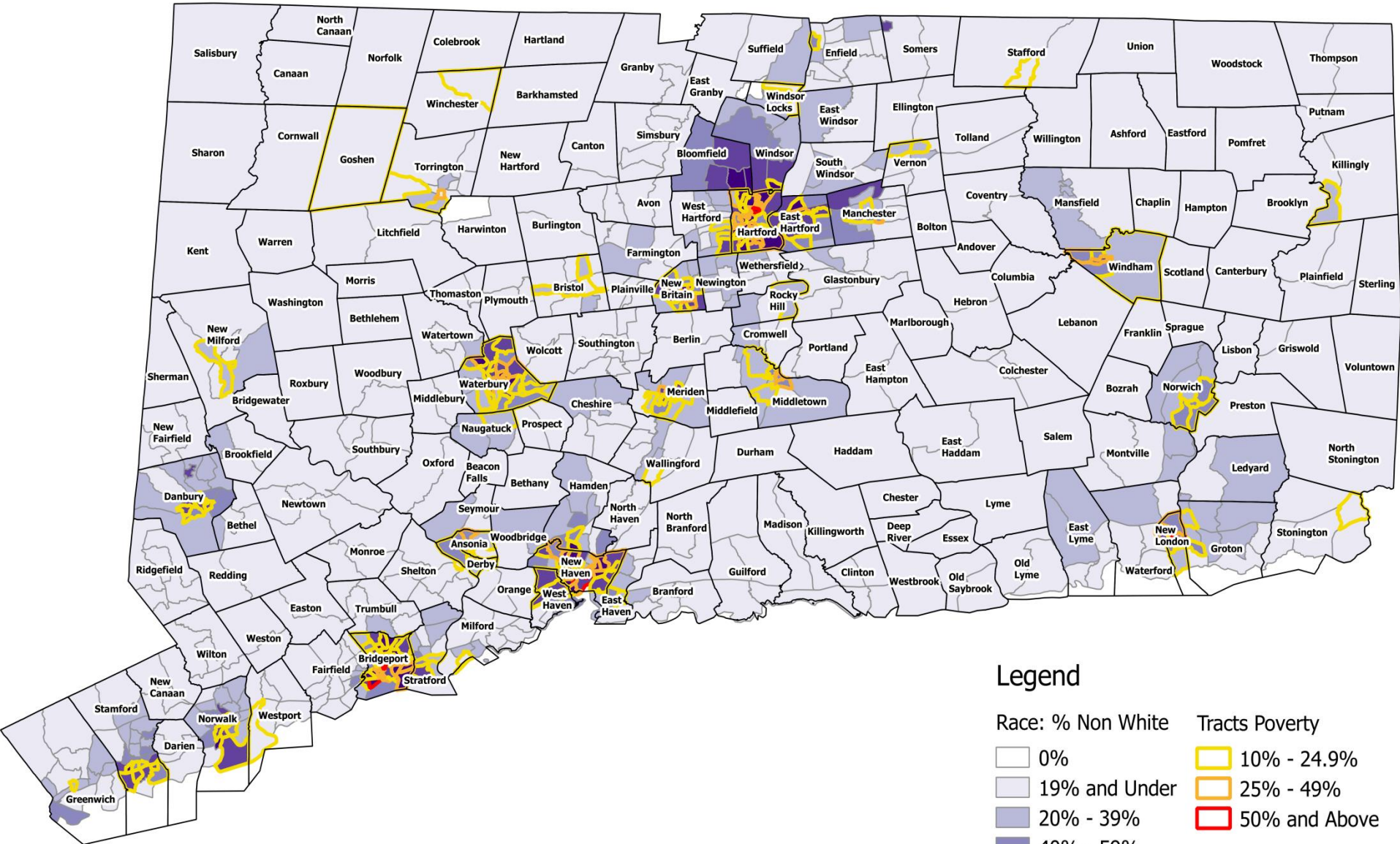

# Race and Poverty

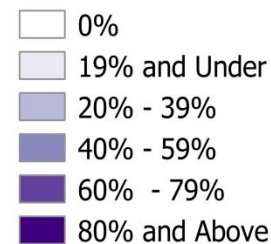
- As you already know from your work in your cities, there is an intersection between race and family economic security

# Connecticut Non-White Population and Poverty Concentration by Census Tract

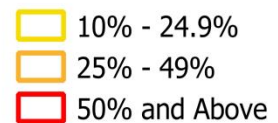

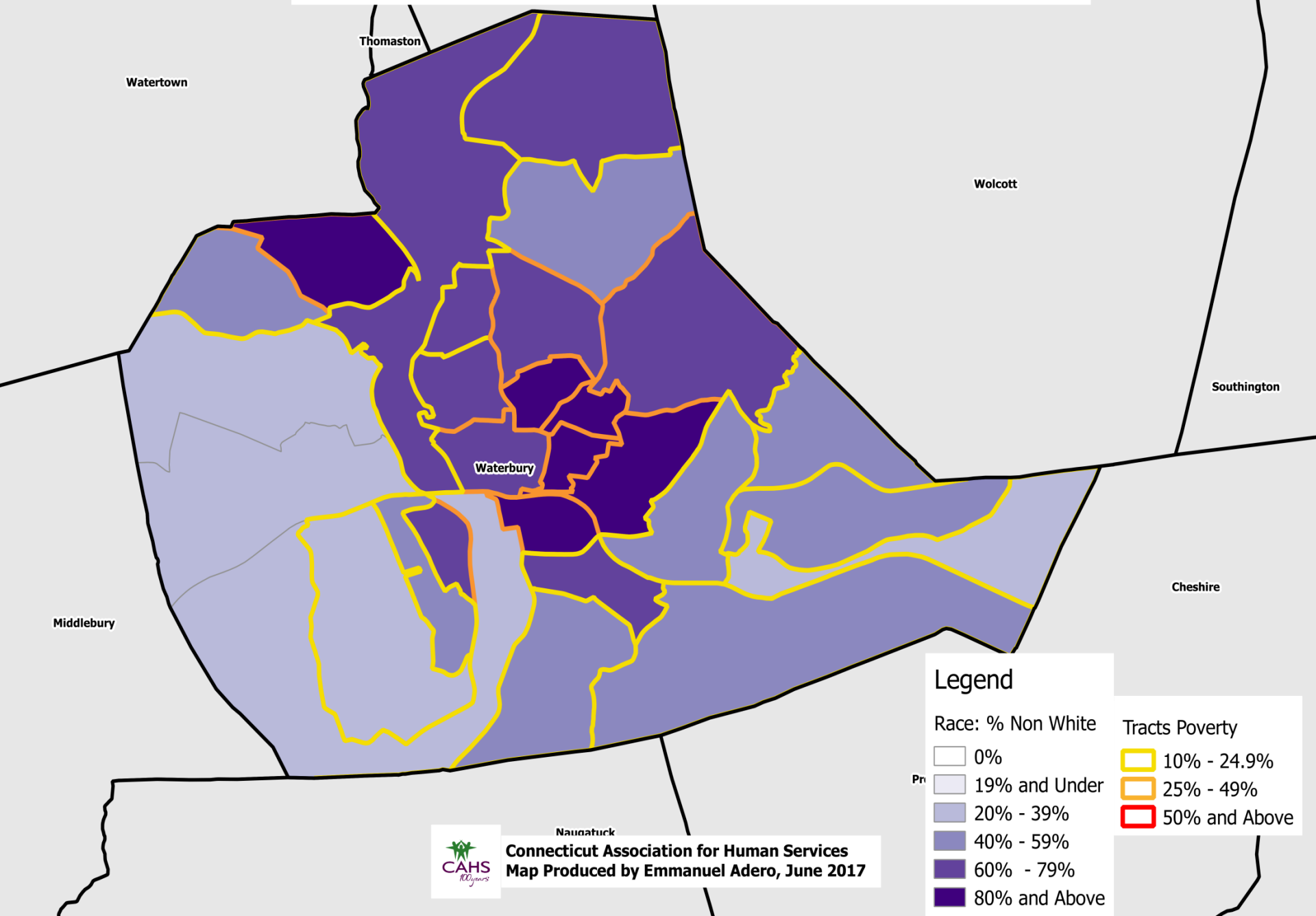
