Brockton



- Brockton became a majority minority city during the last decade, largely because the Black population more than doubled, from 17.8% to 37.7% of the city's total.
- Brockton has almost double the statewide average rate of hospital discharges from asthma.
- While overall the number of jobs in the city was largely unchanged, jobs in wholesale and retail trade declined by more than 5,000.
