

# Fall River



- Even as median family and household income each fell by more than 10%, the number of families receiving TANF declined by 13.8%.
- More than a third of high school students with disabilities (34.3%) drop out before receiving a diploma.
- Admissions to substance abuse programs are more than double the statewide average.
