You requested population migration data for the counties of Maine based on the New England Public Policy Center's recent discussion paper, "New England migration trends." Please see the tables below for these data which report the number of personal exemptions (as reported by the IRS) moving from one county to another county between 2003 and 2004. More information on the methodology is available in the original discussion paper.

Kennebec and York counties experienced the largest net inflow, while Cumberland County had the largest number of people moving in and out. Overall, net migration into Cumberland County was slightly positive. Penobscot County was the only county in Maine to experience a net-outflow of migrants between 2003 and 2004.

Among other counties across New England, the source and destination of people moving to and from Maine tended to be similar, with counties in eastern Massachusetts and southern New Hampshire leading the movement into and out of the Pine Tree state. On net more people moved into Maine from another New England state than moved out of Maine to the rest of the region; in 2003, 11,602 persons (as measured by IRS exemptions) moved from one of the five other New England states to Maine. Meanwhile, 6,948 persons moved out of Maine to another New England state.

Outside of New England, Maine also experienced large migration flows into and out of Florida, New York, California, Virginia, North Carolina, and Texas.

Breaking down inflows and outflows for each county by source of migration, most Maine counties were net importers of people, both from within Maine and from other states around the nation. Penobscot County was the only county in Maine to lose population to other states, while Aroostook, Cumberland, Waldo and Washington counties lost residents to other Maine counties in 2003.
