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
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Figure 1: Initial Claims for Unemployment Insurance

January 8, 2005 - February 4, 2017











Figure 5: Labor Force Participation Rate


January 2005 - January 2017


Figure 6: Median Duration of Unemployment January 2005 - January 2017

2016:Q3 - 2017:Q4








Figure 9: Real Exports of Goods and Services 2005:Q1 - 2016:Q4
